## OUR MEMBERS SAY...

An Interview With Dennis Hodkinson BTech, A.Sc.T, LEED® AP O+M, CCCA, CPHD. — By Josh Dewey A.Sc.T, CTR

**Josh:** I see you have the designation here for CCCA. What does that mean?

**Dennis:** Certified Construction Contract Administrator. It's a designation through CSC that identifies that I have met a set of requirements through training as a professional in contract administration for construction in Canada.

**Josh:** What led you to go down that route from your original path into the design community?

**Dennis:** Well, my company does a lot of contract administration as prime consultants on the engineering side of things. At the time, it was the only recognized designation and RJC has always been a big supporter of CSC nationally, so it made sense to get our people CCCA designated because we have a national company and we'd like to be delivering contract administration consistently across the country. CSC has a national reach and we thought the two married together quite well.

**Josh:** Are you an Engineer with RJC now? What's your background?

**Dennis:** Yes, I have a background in construction management. I'm a Technologist by designation but here I work with a team of engineers and help to deliver projects.

**Josh:** What do you see as your biggest challenge right now in the industry?

**Dennis:** Competency in the trades. I think the Vancouver market is at or beyond saturation. Right now there is too much demand for the skilled labor and so it's putting a lot of pressure on quality and putting a lot of pressure on schedule. And it's driving up costs.

**Josh:** What do you think can be done to help alleviate that issue?

**Dennis:** Owners can defer projects. Defer work where possible. Owners are paying a premium to get work done today. Unless there's a physical reason to do it like if your budgets are disappearing or if it's a safety issue being structural or health related etc... My best advice is to defer the work until skilled labour is available.

**Josh:** How do you think we can alleviate the risk of unskilled labourers installing all these new buildings other than as you mentioned deferring projects? Is there anything that the construction industry could initiate in order to reduce the risk?

**Dennis:** I think all the trade programs need to partner with the industry better. This includes manufacturers, consultants and government as well. From our experience, the walls are where the gap is. It's the cladding systems. I think the other piece we always try and close the gap on is the "work by others." The cladding guy, does he do the sheathing? Does he do the membrane? Who does what? Where does that work start and stop? What are the transitions between the roofs and walls etc. When you talk about proper air tightness at all those skilled job transitions in the walls to windows. Better monitoring on the sites is the key to actually building to the plans and specifications.

**Josh:** What design trends are you seeing taking place right now?

**Dennis:** Our work portfolio is a combination of renovation and new construction projects. I think energy efficiency is the main concern. The step code is driving the energy modelling goals. I think there is a big opportunity for air tightness testing rolling out

in 2019. We have to be responsible design professionals creating and building more efficient buildings. The challenge is in finding the proper balance in design vs. the cost to meet the energy goals set by the National Building Codes.

**Josh:** *As a Certified Construction Contract Administrator, what other courses have you taken specific to CSC?*

**Dennis:** The PCD (Principles of Construction Documentation) Course

**Josh:** *Was there anything out of the CCCA and the PCD classes that really resonated in your business?*

**Dennis:** It was good to hear from an organization about what should be included in the contract documents and how they should be administered through the project. It was very informative. We have everybody in our practice take the PCD course. Most of them do it online because of the flexibility. If we have people who do a lot of contract administration or intending to do contract administration, they all go through the CCCA course. There's a couple of us in my office who have completed the CCCA training.

**Josh:** *How has being a member of CSC benefitted you specifically and individually?*

**Dennis:** I've met a lot of industry folks that I generally would not cross paths with at lunch events and at the national conference. I've met a lot of the Technical Representatives. It helps to put a name to a face and be able to get a faster answer because you have a mutual respect for each other. I think CSC has done a great job of proving a good cross-section of speakers.

Chapter was fortunate to meet Mark Jacobson of Kuraray who discussed designing safer glass railings with laminated glass and the various glass types, considered safety glass, at our monthly luncheon. His presentation was (ahem) impactful and spoke for itself. Thank you Mark for making the time to present for us.

**Josh:** *Is there any courses in particular that you'd like to see added to the next schedule?*

**Dennis:** I think the one thing that needs some clarity in the industry revolves around energy modeling and what the different tools available. We're always deciding which tools to use and which application.

**Josh:** *For someone who wants to get into the Consulting/Design/Engineering side of the industry, what advice would you give them?*

**Dennis:** My career advice is to become an Engineer. There is a shortage for qualified professional Engineers now and there's going to be a shortage for years to come with the infrastructure projects that are being planned for Vancouver BC and other key cities in Canada.

My personal advice is to follow your heart. There's no point in being pigeonholed into a job that you don't appreciate. You have to figure out what you want to do and then do it.

**Josh:** *What do you do in your spare time?*

**Dennis:** I play beach year-round volleyball. There's an indoor beach facility and I play from September to May and then I play outdoors. I used to play 5 days a week but now I play once a week. I have two kids, 10 and 12, they keep us busy. So there are lots of after school activities. We enjoy travelling to new countries as a family and when we can, we like to get out of the city as much as possible. We have a family cabin in the mountains in the South Chilcotin as well outside of Vancouver in the middle of nowhere. Sometimes it is important to just "get off the grid!"

**CCDC 23** is a guide to procuring construction services through the competitive bidding process where the lowest bid selection method is used. It provides owners and consultants with **best practices for a straightforward bidding process** with adequate time for bid preparation and **fair and transparent contract awards**. **Division 00** provides standard master specification text and templates that reflect the best practices contained in **CCDC 23** and is recommended for procurement authorities when preparing the bid documents for a project or office master specifications.
